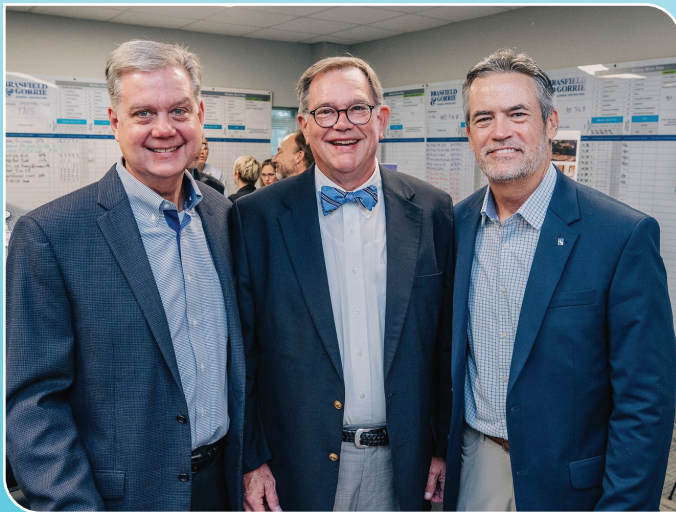

Chad and Brooke Henderson

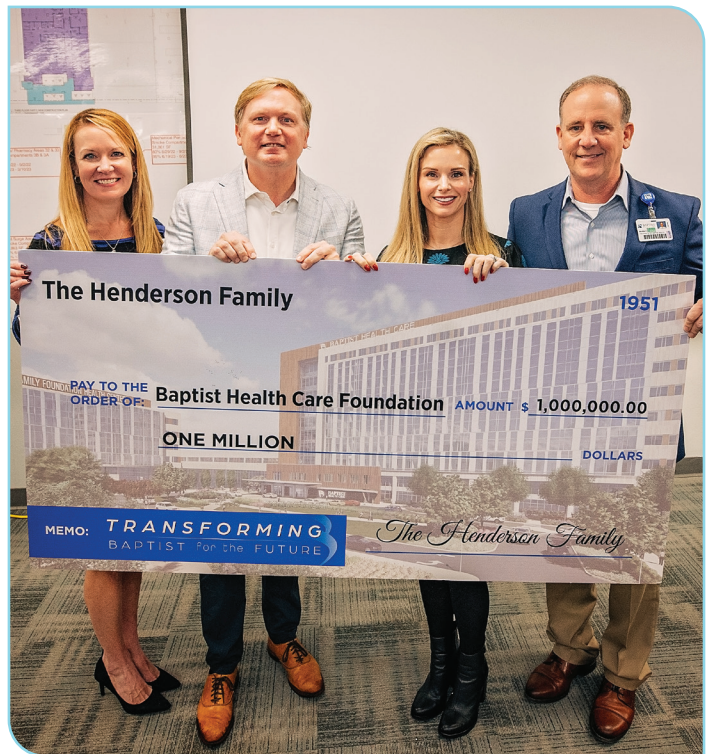
A strong sense of family has been at the forefront of Chad and Brooke Henderson's life journey. Both have been greatly influenced by the important role of family in shaping their beliefs, priorities and actions. Growing up, each of their grandparents led by example in showcasing the significant positive impact of hard work coupled with genuine care and gratitude for their loved ones and respective communities.

It is with this mindset that Chad and Brooke were extremely proud to donate a transformational gift of **\$1 million** to the Foundation's **Transforming Baptist for the Future** campaign in the spirit of Chad's grandparents, Arch and Lorraine Henderson of Pensacola, Florida. In honor of this gift, the 80,000-square-foot medical office building on the new Baptist Hospital campus will be named the **Henderson Health Center**. This health center is scheduled to open in spring 2024.

"We think about how impressive this project is and the positive influence it will have on Northwest Florida," Brooke Henderson said. "We are grateful to live in a community with a provider like Baptist that has made such a significant long-term commitment by investing in this new campus."

Chad and Brooke have amassed numerous memories with Baptist Health Care over the years. They have four children – Charlie, Archie, Mary Jean and Hattie – all of whom were born at Baptist. In addition, both have parents and grandparents who received significant and meaningful care at Baptist. They wanted to give back to Baptist in a way that would have lasting impact for years to come. For that reason, they chose to support the growth at the new Baptist Hospital campus.

"One of the things that's most important to us is to lead by example, just as our grandparents did," Chad Henderson said. "We are blessed and fortunate enough to have had some financial success, so we want to give back and positively impact others. This is our first gift of this magnitude, and we hope it's not the last."



The James M. Cox Foundation

Cox Enterprises' founder, James M. Cox, believed strongly in giving back to the communities where the company does business, and one of many ways in which his values remain present today is through the James M. Cox Foundation. In recognition of his legacy, the foundation was created and named in his honor and provides funding for capital campaigns and special projects in communities where the company operates.

The James M. Cox Foundation awarded the Foundation a **\$500,000** grant to fund **CareView®**, a predictive patient monitoring system designed to help health care providers reduce falls, reduce self-harm and increase patient safety. Because of this generous gift, Baptist can provide our patients and families with the highest level of safety during their stay at the new Baptist Hospital and Behavioral Health Unit.

The Behavioral Health Unit, an inpatient department of Baptist Hospital, will use a more robust version of CareView® for their specialized patient population. The patient monitoring solution uses infrared technology and 24-hour monitoring for patients perceived to be at risk for suicide or self-harm. CareView® also provides virtual bedrails that will alert care teams and allow for a faster response time. This technology is an ideal addition to the behavioral health geriatric unit, where patients are at a much higher risk for falls, especially at night.



Florida Power & Light Company

Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) is gearing up to celebrate its 100th anniversary of service to Florida communities. Currently in its 98th year, FPL is known for its history of giving back through philanthropic gifts, grant funding, community fundraisers and team member volunteer time.

The impact FPL team members have in Northwest Florida is evident with more than 3,000 volunteer hours in the Northwest Florida community and representation on more than 50 different organizational boards. Like Baptist, they believe in helping people throughout life's journey.

Historically, the partnership between Baptist and FPL, and formerly Gulf Power Company, has been strongly aligned in each company's mission, vision and values. The company has been contributing to the Baptist Health Care Foundation for more than 38 years, supporting various programs and services within Baptist's health care system.

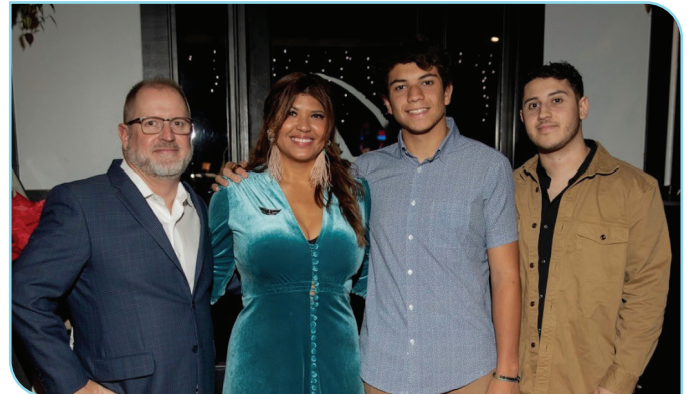
The Gupta Family

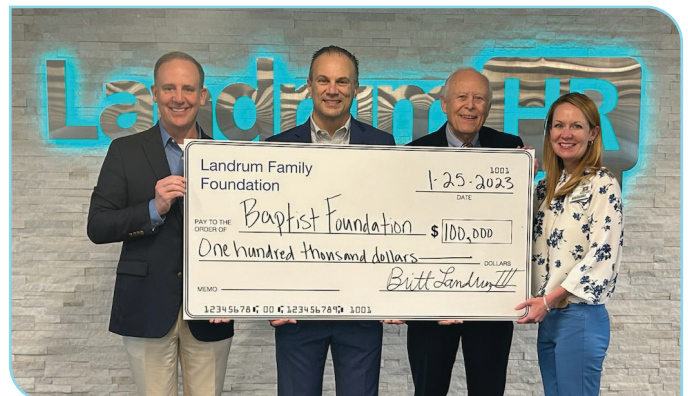
Wendy and Joel Smith

Code Carts

Code Carts

The Foundation purchased 69 new code carts to update and standardize the supply across Baptist, Gulf Breeze and Jay hospitals. The new carts keep all supplies organized inside drawers with each drawer having a breakaway lock that easily indicates which supplies were accessed and need replenishing. This process makes it more efficient and easier to get the carts back in service on the hospital floors to help patients in need.



Dialysis Machine

Dialysis Machine

The Foundation helped purchase a new dialysis machine, called Tablo, for Baptist Hospital. This purchase allowed Baptist to create a new in-house dialysis program for acute care patients and hire six new nurses who are specifically trained in dialysis. The Tablo machine can perform extended treatments in the intensive care unit (ICU), conventional hemodialysis and ultrafiltration, allowing for technology standardization across the continuum of care.

Breast Ultrasound

The Foundation purchased a GE LOGIQ Fortis Ultrasound machine for the Gulf Breeze Hospital imaging services department. The machine is an all-in-one, high-performing ultrasound that can fit a multitude of needs. It is equipped with next-generation imaging technologies that provide exceptional image quality, clarity and clinical confidence. The diagnostic capability of this machine increases the probability of early mass detection, identification and treatment. The goal is to offer the most comprehensive breast imaging for the most favorable outcomes.

“With the addition of this machine, we have been able to create a more convenient, comfortable and welcoming space for our breast imaging patients, eliminating the need for them to walk between floors of the hospital for mammography and ultrasound,” said Amber Branch, imaging services manager, Gulf Breeze Hospital. “The patients have truly appreciated this new experience and comfort while the sonography and mammography teams have greatly benefited from being co-located, which has led to better communication and an enhanced patient experience.”

Operating Room Equipment

The Foundation purchased new equipment and technology for the operating rooms at both Baptist and Gulf Breeze hospitals. In the Baptist OR, the new GlideScope Titanium LoPro improves laryngeal exposure, lowers lift force on patients and increases first-pass success rates. The Stryker Bone Mills will consistently and efficiently reduce bone to appropriate-size particles and reduce time and manual effort. Other new equipment included hysteroscopes, nephroscopes and Urolift scopes to assist in various operating procedures. A new GlideScope was also purchased for Gulf Breeze Hospital's OR, as well as the DeMayo Adapt 2 Fit Modular Knee Positioner, which allows precise control of flexion and extension during surgery, and a Midas Rex Drills Kit that is used in spine surgeries and neurological cases.



Lab Renovations

Lab Renovations

The Foundation supported renovations to the Gulf Breeze Hospital lab needed to prepare for installation of new equipment. The renovations included demolition and removal of existing cabinetry and fixtures and relocation of mechanical and electrical fixtures to accommodate the new lab equipment. The lab upgrades will allow the team to operate more efficiently and continue providing inpatient and outpatient services with more enhanced abilities.

WOMEN'S BOARD OF BAPTIST HEALTH CARE FOUNDATION

Established in 1976, the **Women's Board** of Baptist Health Care Foundation provides consistent support for the community through its commitment to health care initiatives. The Women's Board has raised more than **\$3.5 million** in support of various health care programs at Baptist Health Care. Through their efforts, the Women's Board volunteers have helped our organization make a difference in the lives of thousands in our community, assuring that access to the very best in health care and human services is available to all.

Membership for the Women's Board is open to any woman who is interested in serving her community. Membership meetings are held quarterly and provide members an opportunity to meet new friends, get the latest news from Baptist and learn through fun and educational programs. In addition to the quarterly meetings, the board hosts Women's Night Out events to engage its membership.

The Women's Board has raised funds for programs and projects for multiple departments within the organization including cancer, heart and vascular, women's health, children's services, palliative care, COVID-19, the new Baptist Hospital campus and new Behavioral Health Unit.

46th Annual Stepping Out in Style Fashion Show



The 46th annual **Stepping Out in Style Fashion Show**, presented by the Women's Board of Baptist Health Care Foundation, raised more than **\$130,000** to build a playground at the Behavioral Health Unit (BHU) at the new Baptist Hospital campus.

The BHU provides care to thousands of individuals requiring inpatient behavioral health care each year. More than 1,100 of these patients are children ages 10 to 17 with some patients as young as age 4. The playground will offer a fun and welcoming environment and allow our youngest patients to focus on their recovery.

The fashion show is the largest fundraiser for the Women's Board. The event was held on Oct. 27, 2022, at Sanders Beach Corinne-Jones Resource Center and featured live and silent auctions and emcees Brent Lane and Sue Straughn. Professional and local models showcased the latest fashions from Bluetique, Dillard's, Gulf Coast cabi Stylists, The Market and Mainly Shoes and The South Outfitters.



CASINO ROYALE

This elegant black-tie event brings together Baptist leaders and vendors for a night of first-class dining, dancing, charity auctions and charitable gaming. Each year Casino Royale is inspired by a James Bond movie, with this year's event featuring themes from Quantum of Solace. The 9th annual **Casino Royale Gala** took place on April 21, 2023, and raised nearly **\$285,000**. Proceeds benefitted the new Baptist Hospital campus.

Helping Hands Team Member Giving

Baptist Health Care team members are some of the most generous donors to the Foundation, contributing **\$173,179** last year. Donations to the **Helping Hands Fund** financially impacts three focus areas: assisting team members and their families directly, giving back to our communities and supporting our organizational Mission of helping people throughout life's journey.

TEAM MEMBER IMPACT

- **Emergency Assistance** – **\$74,082** total financial assistance was provided to **55** team members to support them through catastrophic events.
- **Educational Scholarships** – **40** educational scholarships were awarded to team members and their dependents in the amount of **\$1,000** each.
- **Holiday Food Assistance** – **36** team members received food card assistance.
- **Adoption/Foster Care Assistance** – Assistance is available for team members who adopt or earn foster care certification and begin fostering a child(ren).

COMMUNITY IMPACT

- **C.A. Weis Elementary School** – **500** students received Christmas gifts.
- **United Way of West Florida** – A **\$20,000** donation impacted **24** partner agencies and **29** funded programs.
- **Mission Trip Support** – **Six** team members received assistance to support mission trip efforts.
- **Hurricane Ian Relief** – **\$5,000** was donated to the **Florida Hospital Association Health Care Heroes Relief Fund** to benefit health care professionals around Ft. Myers, Florida who were impacted by the storm.

ORGANIZATIONAL SUPPORT

- **Mini-Grants Program** – **11** grants were awarded to departments system-wide for a total impact of **\$40,700**.

MISSION TRIP IMPACT

Marilyn McDaniel, a sonographer at Baptist Hospital, and Laura Bass, a mammography technologist at Jay Hospital, joined Charity Baptist Church on a mission trip to Cuba in July 2023. During the trip, they helped run a Christian youth camp, brought medication to a church-sponsored clinic and invited the communities to participate in church services and activities.



Through the Foundation's Helping Hands program, the team was able to purchase supplies needed for the camp including over-the-counter medication that can be very difficult to find in Cuba.

"Cuba is not for the faint of heart, but the team pressed on through nine days, falling in love with the Cuban people and making lifetime friendships and memories," Laura said. "Twelve people with a heart for missions are

forever changed, and many Cuban people came to know Christ. The teens in the camp are so grateful for our team's help, and the doctor was moved to tears when presented with four very large duffel bags full of medications and bandaging supplies. Thank you, Baptist, for your efforts in helping Cuba!"

MINI-GRANTS IMPACT

“Eyesight is one of the most precious gifts we have. It allows us to see the beauty of the world, to communicate with others and to enjoy our daily activities. However, many people with diabetes may also suffer from vision problems that can affect their quality of life and well-being. Some of these problems can be prevented or treated, but others may lead to irreversible blindness. That is why saving eyesight is so important.

“With the mini-grant we received from the Foundation, we were able to purchase the **RetinaVue® 700 Imager**. This new equipment allows us to obtain images of the patient’s retina at the time of service when they see a primary care provider and then receive the interpretation results from the **RetinaVue®** ophthalmology network within 24 hours. This service acts as a method of screening for retinal disease in patients who have otherwise healthy eyes and don’t normally visit an ophthalmologist. Using this new equipment, we can help our patients save their eyesight so they can take in a view of a sunset or even watch their grandchildren play in little league.

“Saving eyesight is a compassionate act that benefits ourselves and others. It is a way of showing gratitude for the gift of sight and respect for the dignity of every human being. It is a way of making the world a brighter and better place.”



MAMMOGRAM FUND

Throughout the year, the Foundation partners with Baptist’s cancer and imaging departments to raise funds that support Baptist’s mammogram program and awareness about the importance of breast health. The Foundation’s **Mammogram Fund** provides mammograms year-round to individuals in need in our communities. This program would not be possible without the generous support of our donors who contributed **\$140,704** this year.

Over the last **14 years** of this program, screenings have been provided to **2,787** people. As a result of these screenings, **741** required additional testing, **94** required biopsies and **32** were diagnosed with breast cancer.
