## Financial Focus: Gifts of Real Estate

A gift of real estate can be beneficial for both the giver and the recipient. Gifts of real property can include a home, vacation property, vacant land, farmland, ranch or commercial property. Presenting such a gift to the Baptist Health Care Foundation helps further our mission to grow philanthropic resources for improving health and human services in our community. For the property owner there are several advantages.

### Benefits of property donation include:

- Avoiding capital gains tax
- Receiving a charitable income tax deduction
- Leaving a lasting legacy

### How does one make a gift of real property?

A property donation to the Foundation can be made by executing or signing a deed to transfer ownership. Part or all of real property can be deeded to our organization. Real estate worth typically is based on the property's fair market value, which must be established by an independent appraisal.

### Can mortgaged property be donated?

Please call the Foundation office if the property you wish to give has existing debt or a mortgage. We also can discuss the capital gains tax implications of your gift.
